District Highlight - Warren City Schools

In the Spring of 2023, The Kids Read Now program provided 8 free books over the summer to 13 McKinney-Vento students ranging from K-5. When I met with the students about picking out their books, one student's comment was "do we have to turn these back in?" Once they heard they were able to keep all 8 books, their eyes widened as a smile appeared on their faces realizing they will have something new of their own to cherish. Another student stated they never had the chance to pick out a brand new book before, and was worried if they would pick out the wrong book. Just with these 2 comments, it goes to show our students really appreciate this program. The 13 students who participated have seen an increase in their grades. Several of these students wish that they could have another Kids Read Now opportunity throughout the year.

Parent Cafe: This is a new Parent/Guardian Support Service for those who are having a difficult time handling a student. The meetings will begin the week of October 2. Time and location will be announced. At the Parent Cafe meetings, a family dinner will be served and child care will be provided at no cost to the family. The meetings are informal and discussion will be about real life current issues, while trying to problem solve.

Middle School Warrior Wellness Day October 26: This is the second time Warrior Wellness Day will be offered to our 7th and 8th graders. The purpose of Warrior Wellness Day is to provide our students with resources to cope with everyday stressors as well as to prepare them with opportunities they would not seek out on their own. Community partners come and present to 4 groups for 30 minutes each group. The information provided to the students is hands-on materials; this was the best way the students learned from their feedback. By providing wellness days for our students, it continues to be a reminder that there is help out there for them and all they have to do is ask.

Updates

Jenny Maze met with local liaisons at Belpre and Warren to start the beginning stages of planning wellness days in our other districts. She also attended a virtual positive attendance conference with hopes to implement the practices she learned.
